Resolution No. __5 Series of 2018

OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF RA NO. 10912 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD) ACT OF 2016" FOR VETERINARY MEDICINE

WHEREAS, Section 2, Article 1 of Republic Act (RA) No. 9268 entitled "An Act to Regulate the Practice of Veterinary Medicine in the Philippines, Repealing for the purpose R.A. No. 382 and for other purposes", provides for the policy of the State to safeguard and professionalize the practice of the Veterinary profession, to wit:

"Section 2. Declaration of Policy. It shall be the policy of the State to upgrade the practice of veterinary medicine in the Philippine for the purpose of protecting the animal population in the country through safe and proper diagnosis, treatment, and surgery of these animals. The State recognizes the important role of veterinarians in nation-building and promotes the sustained development of veterinarians whose competencies have been validated by honest and credible licensure examination and whose standards of professional practice and service are world-class and internationally recognized."

WHEREAS, under Section 15, Article IV of Republic Act (RA) No. 10912, otherwise known as the "Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Act of 2016", the Professional Regulatory Boards (Boards) are given the authority to prescribe their own requirements or procedure relating to the CPD as may be pertinent and applicable to their respective profession, PROVIDED, that the same does not contravene any of the provisions of R.A. No. 10912 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR);

WHEREAS, after a series of consultative meetings with the stakeholders, it was agreed that the set of Operational Guidelines of the CPD Council as formulated by the Professional Regulatory Board for Veterinary Medicine (Board) be implemented.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board hereby **RESOLVED**, as it now **RESOLVES**, to formulate its own Operational Guidelines for the CPD Program in accordance with the provisions of R.A. No. 10912 and its IRR as follows:

Section 1. Date/s of Regular Meeting. The CPD Council of Veterinary Medicine (CPD Council) under the supervision of the Board, is hereby mandated under this Resolution to meet every 3rd Friday of the month for the purpose of evaluating the applications for accreditation as CPD provider, programs, self-directed and/or lifelong learning and other CPD related matters.

Section 2. List of requirements for accreditation for CPD Provider. The list of documentary requirements for accreditation of CPD Local and Foreign providers as provided in Resolution No. 1032, Series of 2017, also known as the, "Implementing Rules and Regulations of R.A. No. 10912, is hereby adopted.

Section 3. List of additional requirements for CPD Program. The list of documentary requirements for accreditation of CPD program as provided in Resolution No. 1032, Series of 2017, shall also include but not be limited to:

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- 3.1 Letter of endorsement from the specific Veterinary Specialty Board for CPD program(s) or course(s) designed for specialty certification prior to submission for approval by the CPD Council.
- 3.2 Template for Instructional Design

A copy of the Application Form for Accreditation of CPD Program and template for Instructional Design are hereto attached as Annexes "A" and "B" respectively.

Section 4. MATRIX OF CPD ACTIVITIES

Section 5. CPD Provider Completion Report. The list of documentary requirements for the submission of Completion Report as provided in Resolution No. 1032, Series of 2017, shall also include:

5.1 List of Participants and Report on Participants Evaluation (if passed, failed or provisional passed on post test)

A copy of the Completion Report Form is hereto attached as Annex "C".

Section 6. Maximum Creditable Units for Self-Directed Learning Modality. The maximum creditable units for self-directed or lifelong learning is forty-five (45) credit units for the three (3) year compliance period.

Section 7. Major Areas of CPD Activities. The CPD activities shall be divided into three (3) major areas with the corresponding credit units (CU), as follows:

Section 8. Required CPD Credit Units in a Compliance Period. – All Veterinarians shall be required to comply with forty-five (45) CPD credit units within a compliance period of three (3) years. The implementation of this section will start on 2019.

Section 9. For Overseas Professionals on how to comply with CPD. Veterinarians working overseas may take programs/seminars through the foreign chapters or affiliates







of accredited CPD Providers. They may also attend seminars/trainings conducted by non-accredited CPD Providers and apply for credit unit/s with the CPD Council under Self-Directed Learning Modality.

Section 10. CPD Credit Units. Registered and licensed professionals shall complete the required credit units every three (3) years.

Any excess CUs earned shall not be carried over to the next three-year period except credit units earned for doctoral and master's degrees or specialty trainings which shall only be credited once during the compliance period.

One lecture/workshop hour of a CPD Program shall be equivalent to one (1) CU.

Section 11. Repealing Clause. All Resolutions, Orders, Circulars, Issuances and parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Resolution are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 12. Effectivity. This Resolution shall take effect after fifteen (15) days after its full and complete publication in the Official Gazette or in major newspaper of general circulation in the country.
